

Mrs V.E.M. Berry

Full minutes of the recent Parish Council meeting are available on the Parish Web site at <http://www.hankertonvillage.co.uk>. In summary the main discussion points were:

- Flood prevention** - The issue of flooding and excess surface water at properties was raised; the PC had been trying to get landowners to clean out their ditches for some years now, with very little success, and was now approaching the Wiltshire Council Operational Flood Working Group about it. It was suggested that the first problem to be tackled would be getting permission from the landowners to clean out their ditches for them.
- Village Sign on Cloatley Road.** The Chairman said that a village resident had recently re-raised with him the subject of the PC making a donation to the North Aisle to recognize the use of the painting of the church on the planned new road sign. The PC had previously decided that the annual donation of £400 would suffice. The PC now agreed that a £20 donation was appropriate.
- Bus Shelter.** The seat needed repair or renewal. Cllr Dalton said he would do it and that he would look for volunteers if he needed them. The PC would pay for new wood. The Chairman pointed out that the memorial plaque in the bus shelter gave no detail of Jack Tugwell's death in World War II other than the bare fact and suggested that the PC should investigate more detail and renew the plaque accordingly. It was pointed out that the family would need to be asked for their permission.
- Snow Clearance.** The Wilts Council response dated 10 Apr 13 had been circulated before this meeting to all Cllrs. It was agreed that Cllr Grierson would speak to the responsible farmer to ensure he understood the Wilts Council system for authorizing farmers who held Council snow ploughs, to use them when needed.
- Highways and Footpaths.** Some footpaths were suffering from long grass. Some could not be accessed by a tractor and topper, but some could. Cllr Grierson would mention this to some landowners.

Handover of the local Rotary Club Presidency

Once again the local Rotary Club of the South Cotswolds has come to the end of its Presidential Year. Philip Selwood from Hankerton now stands down and hands over the presidency to Nigel Gilhead from Crudwell. Nigel Walker from Lea has taken over as the Vice President.

Looking back on his year in office Philip said that the highlight for him was the celebrations surrounding the Olympic Games and, particularly, the Rotary Club providing the opportunity for wheelchair-bound Scott Pockett and his family from Charlton to go to the Para-Olympic Games in London. The club also got very involved in helping people affected by the floods in Malmesbury – the Rotary Clubs in Britain have a stock of dehumidifiers for just such events and many of these were brought to Malmesbury and put to use. One thing that got particular attention from the local press was the Rotary Club of the South Cotswolds obtaining four (live) chickens to replace those lost by the Copeland family children during the floods. The South Cotswolds club covers Malmesbury, Tetbury and the surrounding villages – and is strongly represented in the villages around Malmesbury.
