Their customers sent the laundry, delivered by servants, mostly by horse and cart, although some did have motors. It was 4d for big linen sheets, 2d for stiff collars, 4d for gentlemen's evening shirts, and riding breaches. They washed and ironed all week. Sunday evenings, after chapel, they would go out for walks.

Eva and Elizabeth married and left home but Eleanor (known as Nellie) stayed and didn't marry till later in life, she continued working for some years even after her mother died and she married Frank Winwood. Nellie continued to live at 28, Hankerton until she died in 1979.
