## Nature Diary – December 2022.

You are watching all the small birds hopping and flying around your back garden when this huge, grey blur of a bird swoops in to join in the feeding. In Hankerton, it probably visits most days, but I still feel that the Woodpigeon (*Columba palumbus*) looks almost turkey-like in comparison when you see it next to a sparrow or finch. It's probably true that people are a bit dismissive of the woodpigeon, but a closer look reveals a bird of subtle colouration and markings that border on the attractive – even if its head is too small for its body!



Traditionally a bird of woods and farmland, it is now a very common visitor to gardens. In 1999 it displaced the Starling from the “Top Ten” list of garden birds (British Trust for Ornithology) and currently stands at number 4 – (was that a bit too much like Tony Blackburn?). It has always been viewed as a problem bird by those growing arable crops as it does consume large quantities of fresh greens, and large flocks can do significant damage to a field of over-wintering oilseed rape. At this time of the year big flights of them can certainly be seen moving around the countryside. Through much of the year their diet is primarily seed and green plant material, only occasionally eating small invertebrates or worms. In the autumn they are particularly fond of beech mast and acorns.

An interesting feature of the woodpigeon is that, like other pigeon species, they drink by sucking up water through their bill and swallowing without raising their heads. The small birds sharing the drinking water by comparison, dip their bills into the water, and then lift their heads to swallow, then repeating the process until sated. That is not the only unusual behaviour in this species – they feed their young on milk. In pigeons, the part of the oesophagus known as the crop produces a secretion rich in protein which is fed to



the young pigeons, known as squabs, in the nest. So the woodpigeons are not reliant on insects and invertebrates in their diet to provide their young with the protein necessary for growth, unlike other bird species. Nor do they have to synchronise their breeding to the emergence of a particular food source, as long as the parent is able to find its usual food, it can raise young. This means that woodpigeons can breed at any time, but it is mainly spring and summer.

The parents construct a nest of twigs in a tree, usually a coniferous species, and balanced 3 to 4 metres off the ground where a branch meets the trunk. I read that



“they are not the greatest of nest builders”, which is a polite understatement! It is not unusual for the nest, eggs or young to get blown out of the tree. It has to be said that the squab is not the prettiest of newly hatched birds, perhaps a face that only its mother could love. They are fed on the parent’s crop milk and are able to manage independent flight at around 35 days old. When you see a newly fledged woodpigeon it lacks the white patches of the parents on either side of the neck, and the facial feathers are not fully developed

so that the beak seems especially prominent, but at least its looks are starting to improve from its nestling days.

Later on in the winter when the ivy berries have ripened, you can often see woodpigeons clambering around the ivy bush feeding on the berries. For a large bird they seem quite agile – well, most of the time. In continental Europe woodpigeons are known to migrate south for the winter, but it is uncertain if that is true for birds in the UK. For a fairly common, but perhaps unglamorous species, they haven’t attracted the same amount of scientific attention as many other species, and that side of the UK population’s behaviour has not yet been researched fully.

The scientific world may be ignoring the woodpigeon at the moment, but with its attractive plumage, fascinating biology and population growth, (despite idiosyncratic nesting skills), it is well worth paying it a little more attention, and as the winter gets colder they will no doubt visit our gardens very frequently.

# Patients Participation Group

## Surgery News - Staffing

3 new Clinical practitioners have been appointed by the Primary Care Network across the group (Malmesbury, Purton, Sherston, New Court, Cricklade) making 9 in total.

2 will be full time at Malmesbury Primary Care Centre (MPCC) providing care for minor illnesses. Fatima Birkett is growing the Well Being Team which provides support for patients needing care at home or short-term transition into a care home and is also the link between MPCC and the community.

Jess Bolton is the Mental Health Care nurse.

Jo Harris is the Living Team member dealing with mental health, loneliness and Alzheimer's issues.

## Surgery Refurbishment

MPCC don't own the building they use and with an increase in staff numbers they are looking at the practicalities of utilising the space more efficiently and differently.

## Telephones

The current system is outdated with limited functionality. A company has been appointed to install a new system by Jan 2023. The new system will have unlimited lines, an option for a call back when you're number 1 in the queue and a function to check appointment times. Currently there are 16 receptionists who just answer the phone.

## Vaccine & Covid

Flu vaccination clinics started on a Saturday in September and are expected to run until mid-December.

MPCC are only contracted to provide Covid vaccines for patients:

- Age 75 and over
- Over 18's who have severely compromised immune system
- Care home residents
